On behalf of the American Thoracic Society (ATS), I am writing to express our support for legislation you are sponsoring, the Healthcare Workforce Resilience Act, S. 1024. The ATS is a multi-disciplinary society of 16,000 pulmonary, critical care and sleep specialists, many of whom are working on the frontlines of the COVID-19 pandemic, treating patients with this disease and conducting critical research to improve our understanding of it and develop new diagnostics, therapeutics and vaccines.

Prior to the pandemic, the U.S. was facing a serious shortage of physicians, including pulmonary, critical and sleep specialists, largely due to the growth and aging of the population and the impending retirements of many physicians. The COVID-19 pandemic has further highlighted our need to address our physician shortage and ensure International Medical Graduates (IMGs), are supported while providing care. This heightened demand for physicians will only continue to mount. Thus, increasing the number of visas that are available to IMGs, as proposed by S. 1024, is critical to addressing this growing shortage.

The ATS understands the critical role that IMGs play in the United States healthcare system. The Healthcare Workforce Resilience Act would allow the recapture of 15,000 unused employment-
